Only the Principle Investigator is eligible to submit an IRB Proposal

IRB Committee Review

IRB committee assesses ethical criteria of the study

Conduct Research

Follow approved protocol and procedures

Update the IRB Committee

It is the PI's responsibility to submit project changes and completion reports

Principle Investigator (PI)

- Takes full responsibility for the conduct of the study, including the eligibility and training of the researchers
- Writes and submits the IRB proposal

Eligible to be a PI*

- Tenure-track faculty
- Non-tenure-track faculty

Not eligible to be a PI

- Medical students
- Residents
- Research coordinators
