Tips for Creating Your Award-Winning Poster

Network, get feedback, collaborate and expand your medical research impact!

General guidelines:

- 1. Start early
 - ideally 3 weeks before presenting
- 2. Follow your Conference poster guidelines:
 - o Size: 42" tall, up to 66" wide
- 3. Carefully consider your audience
- 4. Condense titles, text to key messages
- 5. Get feedback from others, revise your content and presentation style

Considerations while preparing your poster:

- 1. Keep the title short: attention-grabbing
- 2. Place the text in columns and use large font (18-24 points)
- Logically organize your poster sections: introduction, methods, results, discussion, and acknowledgments
- 4. Ensure your organization and flow are well balanced between text and graphics
- 5. Use images that present key messages to engage viewers
- 6. Make a caption for each figure and table
- 7. State explicit goal / unique study perspective
- 8. Where feasible, use bulleted or numbered lists
- 9. Include your contact information

Considerations while presenting your poster:

- 1. Prepare your poster presentation pitch (2, 5, and 10 minutes)
- 2. Think ahead about questions you might be asked and prepare answers
- 3. Avoid clothes that will clash with the color scheme you choose for your poster
- 4. Consider making handouts (or a QR code) for videos and other relevant resources




Figure 1. Example of a MSRPP Student's Poster from the 2020 Colloquium
