



Hiring Process

- Hiring Manager Subject Expert (e.g. Medical Director)
 - Asks HR Manager / Recruiter for top ~10 candidates
- HR Manager Non-Subject Expert People-Person
 - Posts position, filters 100's to 1,000's of resumes
 - Primary Filter is Match Between the Job Description and your Resume

Resumes & Cover Letters

- SECRET TIP:
 - It's not all about you!
 - It's about how you MATCH the JOB DESCRIPTION and COMPANY
- Cover Letters are critical
 - How found, research, fit
 - Your unique benefits to company
 - Thank you and follow-up

Resume - Overview

- 1-2 Page Only!
- Font 10.5 min 12pt
 11pt is my preference
- Think Executive Summary
- Remember a non-technical HR manager is likely the first filter / reviewer (Networking can help you circumvent this filter in the future)

 - 2-3 GREAT and 2 GOOD

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

Resume – Bullet Structure

- Bullets need..
 - Start with Action Verb
 - #, \$, %... Help quantify how big accomplishment
 - Results, Achievement,
 Scale, not just what you did!

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Resume – Examples

- Waiter provide outstanding customer service in English & Spanish. Open and Close with \$2,000 in register
- Scholarship or Award
 - 1 out of 10?
 - 1 out of 10,000
 - What were characteristic of event
- Do you participate in events or Shadow?
 - What did you learn?
 - Accomplishments?
 - Don't look like a Pizza Eater!




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Networking in person tips

- Dress Sharp! (First Impressions are important)
- Be Approachable and Professional if appropriate
- - Stay LATE if you can

Be PREPARED Who to meet? What to accomplish?





Make a great first impression!!

- What makes a great first impression?
 - Dress Professional and Sharp
 - Introduce yourself
 - Make Eye Contact
 - Shake hands Confidently
 - Show Enthusiasm!!

Stand up and take turns introducing yourself to your neighbor on each side

- Write down
 - >3-5 Education: Major/Minor, Research, Aspirations
 - ➢ 3-5 Professional: Job, Internship, Experience, Skills
 - ≻3-5 Social: Clubs, orgs, music, free time...
 - > 3-5 Unique personal: What makes you special?
- ➢ GOAL: Convey what makes you unique and interesting and a great fit



Interesting Examples



- Education
 - Undergrad Degree, Grad Degrees, Minors, Aspirations
 - Research / Specialty, focus, or just top interest
 - Think about what relates most to your job and the organizations
- Professional:
 - Work, Internship / Co-op experience, Summer Jobs
 - What are your Ninja skills?
 - Career Aspirations, Career Indecisions
- Social
 - College Team Fan
 - Volunteer Activities (Be careful about religious affiliations)
 - Dancing, Music, Books, Movies...
- Unique personal
 - Where born & raised
 - Family
 - Hobbies
 - Sports





Activity: Interesting Conversation

• What did you discover?



- You can use this technique to create a 30 second elevator pitch!
- <u>Goal</u>: Tell a story about yourself that illustrates who you are, your unique skills, and why you are a <u>great fit</u> for the job & Company

Rearrange to Tell your story casually, NOT memorized

- 1) Born and raised in Atlanta, GA, but TAMU MEEN grad
- 2) 25 years in Medical Device
- 3) From Engineer to Director Global Marketing
- 4) Prior to coming back to TX my family and I were in Seattle for 1 ¹/₂ years (survived a winter)
- 5) I'm the Assoc. Dir. TAMU Career Center, responsible for the employment of 19,000+ engineering students
- 6) Enjoy mentoring students in entrepreneurial events such as Aggies Invent and 3DS



Putting it all Together


- "Tell me about yourself?"
 - Pick top 8-12 items
 - Arrange order into a story
 - Practice, Practice, Practice





STAR Method for Interviews

- <u>Best way to answer Behavioral</u> Interviews I've seen in my career
- 10 20 stories can answer virtually any behavioral questions
- Prep stories for bullets on your resume
- STAR interview method is in the "Career Guide" or you can google it





STAR - Example

- <u>Situation</u>: problem encountered
- <u>Task or Tactics</u>: your plan to solve
- <u>Action</u>: what you did
- <u>Result</u>: quantify accomplishments





Company Knowledge

- The job often goes to the most **PREPARED**
 - What do they sell, make, or service provided?
 - Who are their customers?
 - How are their financials?
 - What divisions do they have and which ones are you interested in?
 - What products excite you (know their names)?
 - Investor information tab for public companies
- Are you following them on LinkedIn?



Close Like a Sales Pro

- Thank you for
- I believe my skills / experience are a great match for ...
- Do you have any additional questions or is there anything we may not have covered...?
- What is the next step in the process?
- If I don't hear back by _____, who should I contact?
- Ask for a business card or write down their name (Given quantity of student at career fair, they may not provide)
- Write down notes immediately following conversation!
- Send "Thank you" email <48hrs (Roland's rule SAME DAY! Remember you want to stand out from others). Show interest and remind why a great fit. Perfect grammar and spelling!



Career Fair Checklist

- Game plan (Networking, Companies, Checklist)
- □ Resume Error Free & enough copies in Folder
- □ Researched company and have questions ready
- □ Make a Great first impression
- Elevator Pitch about FIT smooth & casual
- □ Have your stories and STAR method rehearsed
- □ "Close" like a pro!


